MAHEC Supports HOSA at State Conference

Missouri AHEC once again showed its support for Missouri HOSA by bringing competitors, judges and volunteers to the annual HOSA – Future Health Professionals State Leadership Conference held on March 26-27, 2018 at the Missouri University of Science and Technology in Rolla, Missouri. There were 1300 students and chapter advisors in attendance. The top three medalists in each of the 56 competitive events have an opportunity to compete at the upcoming HOSA International Leadership Conference in Dallas, Texas, on June 27-30, 2018.

In March, representatives from AHEC participated in the HOSA State Conference serving as judges of competitive events which were categorized into health science and professions events, emergency preparedness, leadership, teamwork, and recognition events. Others volunteered to man the Help Desk over the course of the two-day event and provided logistical support for the attendees.

AHEC and HOSA missions both include promoting career opportunities in the health care industry and enhancing the delivery of quality health care to all Missourians. Every regional AHEC in the state partners with Missouri HOSA in one way or another – promoting and creating chapters within schools, providing support to advisors of existing school-based chapters, and providing resources to individual students.

There are more than 3,600 HOSA members across the state – middle school, secondary, postsecondary, adult and collegiate students enrolled in health science education and biomedical science programs or who have interests in pursuing careers in health professions. Project Lead the Way is a driving force behind Missouri HOSA.

Currently the Kansas City STEM Alliance is funding AHEC to promote HOSA and maintain eleven chapters in the Kansas City area. In the past, Missouri AHEC has received funding from the Missouri Foundation for Health to create HOSA chapters in high schools in the northeast portion of the state and middle school chapters throughout most of the state.
